About Our Job

Our Mountain Parks Forestry Workers perform a variety of tasks un support of Forestry Operations within Denver's Mountain Parks system. This historic system, established in 1912, consists of 22 accessible parks and 24 conservation/wilderness areas totaling over 14,000 acres and forming one of the most expansive and unique park systems in the country.

This position will report to the Mountain Parks Headquarters at 300 Union Avenue, Morrison, CO 80645. These positions will work Mon – Fri and will work between 4 – 10 hours per day depending on work demands. These positions will be seasonal and will last approximately 11 months. *The full pay range of this Job Classification is \$15.38 - \$22.45, our target starting pay for this position is \$18.00 per hour.*

Skills to be developed and utilized:

- Working outdoors (potentially in inclement weather conditions) and in office and through the guidance of our Mountain Parks Forester, completing various mountain parks forestry operations tasks, such as but not limited to:
 - o Cruising, site assessment and data collection for forest-wide inventory
 - Chainsaw operation to assist with thinning, firewood, insect/disease management, fire mitigation, etc.
 - Assisting with fire mitigation service contract layout and management; cruising, boundary delineation and marking using GPS and GIS applications and editing/writing technical reports
 - Various light to heavy physical labor on projects and tasks involving use of manual and power operated tools; fencing, facility and equipment maintenance, etc.
- Performs other related duties as needed such as but not limited to snow removal operations

This is an on-call position which will work no more than 39 hours per week and is not eligible for benefits. On-call positions may have routine or variable work schedules.
