POSITION: Seasonal Biologist

Colorado Parks and Wildlife's Resource Stewardship Program is seeking to fill a seasonal biologist position. This 40 hour per week position is split between field based biological surveys, survey data management, cartography, and resource management plan writing. Office location is the CPW central office in north Denver location.

DUTIES:

This position's primary responsibilities will be coordinating the mapping non-native plant populations in state parks, managing GIS data, and writing invasive vegetation management plans. The position requires extensive time in the field and overnight car camping in state parks. Work vehicle, field gear, and travel per diem are provided. This position requires fast paced work and the ability coordinate a team of individuals. Some supervision and/or training of seasonal and full-time employees may be included. Administrative, scheduling and filing tasks will make up about 10% of the work.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Applicant should have a background in ecology, wildlife, botany, or natural resources, GIS or other natural resource sciences and have 1 year or more or more of work experience using ESRI ArcGIS products. Experience with ArcCollector is a plus. Use of GIS in an educational setting will be considered for GIS work experience. Experience with plant/weed identification and the use of GPS and GIS technology is particularly important for this position.

An *ideal* candidate will have:

- 1. Experience with plant and noxious weed identification.
- 2. Experience performing field work and a willingness to travel across the state.
- 3. At least 1 year of experience using ESRI ArcGIS 10 (or later) software.
- 4. Experience with the use of Collector for ArcGIS.
- 5. Experience maintaining/populating databases.
- 6. Ability to create GIS maps to illustrate on-the-ground natural resource conditions.
- 7. Ability to communicate information clearly and concisely, develop reports and present information both orally and in writing.
- 8. Experience with wildlife and/or vegetation sampling techniques.
- 9. Experience planning field work and coordinating field crews.

- 10. Understanding of natural resource and public land management principles and an understanding of how natural sciences relate to land management.
- 11. Strong work ethic, be organized and have the ability to work in a fast paced setting both independently and on teams.
- 12. Willingness to perform overnight field work in parks across the state.
- 13. Must have (or obtain) a Colorado Driver's license.

This position provides a great opportunity to gain experience in GIS, public land management, resource management planning, and conservation in a practical real world setting. For more info on CO Parks and Wildlife - please see - <u>www.cpw.state.co.us</u>.
