Responding to an ever-increasing need for native and ecotypic plant materials, The Southern Rockies Seed Network was established in 2014 as a regional collaborative partnership. Our goal is to develop native ecotypic plant material for ecological restoration/conservation projects.

We work with a diverse group of public and private partners including: restoration practitioners, non-profits, multi-level government organizations, seed growers and distributors, nurseries, and researchers.
