

2021-22 Environmental Education Corps Bird Conservancy of the Rockies Position Description

Environmental Educator

Program Overview: Led by the Colorado Alliance for Environmental Education (CAEE), the Environmental Education Corps (eeCorps) AmeriCorps Program places AmeriCorps members at organizations throughout Colorado to focus on increasing environmental literacy for PreK-12 students and implementing the goals outlined in the Colorado Environmental Education Plan. eeCorps works directly with teachers, schools, and environmental education providers to support them in expanding reach and increasing impact of EE programming, while providing access to equitable learning experiences for all PreK-12 students. eeCorps members provide direct service to improve outcomes in Environmental Stewardship and Education. AmeriCorps provides opportunities to improve lives and foster civic engagement all across the country.

This position will be located at Bird Conservancy of the Rockies, which is located in Brighton, CO. Bird Conservancy of the Rockies conserves birds and their habitats through an integrated approach of science, education and stewardship. Our work extends from the Rockies to the Great Plains, Mexico and beyond. Our mission is advanced through sound science, achieved through empowering people, realized through stewardship and sustained through cross-border collaborations. We acknowledge that a long history of deep-seated discrimination has influenced who has access to and feels comfortable in the outdoors and in the conservation movement. We recognize that this is reflected in the current limited diversity within our organization. Though long overdue, we are now committed to be an organization that empowers people of all backgrounds, beliefs, colors and creeds to join in, benefit from and contribute to our mission. We believe that being inclusive and equitable is essential to our work. We encourage feedback and suggestions as we navigate our collaborative path forward. Together, we are improving native bird populations, the land, and the lives of people.

<u>Service Position Summary</u>: The Environmental Educator will be responsible for delivering high quality, experiential environmental education programs to audiences of all ages. They will also assist with the organizational details and logistics involved in the planning and delivering of these programs.

Essential Functions (Primary Responsibilities): eeCorps members engage with their Host Site organizations to develop, implement, and enhance programs, projects, and activities that will create progress towards eeCorps' and Bird Conservancy of the Rockies' goals. These duties include:

- Assist with the development of the Growing Naturally Early Childhood Education Program for learners aged 0-5
- Deliver educational programs including: classroom presentations, field trips, early childhood programs, outreach events, partner events and virtual programs

- Assist with curriculum design, program promotion, pre-program communication, development of props and materials, and program evaluation
- Organize and maintain education materials
- Be a responsible and enthusiastic representative of Bird Conservancy
- Attend all eeCorps AmeriCorps trainings and orientations
- Complete eeCorps required National Days of Service projects as required
- Complete and submit all necessary eeCorps paperwork and reports by predetermined deadlines

Desired Qualifications:

- Demonstrated ability to lead programs for diverse audiences in formal and non-formal outdoor or classroom settings
- Responsible, creative, enthusiastic, flexible, and dedicated to providing a safe and ageappropriate learning environment
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, especially when interacting with coworkers, youth, parents and guardians, teachers and visitors
- Solution-oriented mindset when faced with challenges
- Demonstrated ability to multi-task, prioritize, and display excellent time management skills
- Proficiency using Microsoft Excel, Word and Publisher, Adobe products, and Google Suite
- Ability to communicate (speak, read, write) in Spanish

Required Qualifications:

- A valid U.S. driver's license and personal transportation. Must be willing to travel to program sites along the Front Range. (required)
- Ability to clear state and federal background checks, and National Service Criminal History Check (required)
- Current CPR and First Aid Certifications (required)
- Age 17+ (required)
- High school graduate with diploma, GED, or equivalent (required)
- U.S. Citizenship or lawful permanent resident status (required)
- Ethic of national service and a strong desire to create positive change

Term of Service: This is a Three-Quarter Time (3QT) national and community service position requiring, at a minimum, a total of 1,200 hours during the year (approximately 40 hours/week.) The position begins November 29, 2021 (or sooner) and ends July 29, 2022. Flexible hours are required, including occasional evening and weekend commitments. Member may be required to serve on Days of Service that take place on certain national holidays throughout the year.

Training and Support Provided: eeCorps members receive significant training and experience in community engagement, project implementation, leadership, diverse populations, and more. Up to 20% of total hours served may be spent in applicable approved training and professional development. Members will be supervised and supported by Sarah Doxon, Early Childhood and Family Coordinator, as well as by Erin Dreps, eeCorps Program Coordinator. The 2021-22 cohort of eeCorps members serving throughout the region will act as additional resources and support for each other.

Location and Service Conditions: This position is based at Bird Conservancy of the Rockies, 14500 Lark Bunting Lane, Brighton, CO 80603. Service is also performed at program sites along the Front Range.

Benefits: Three Quarter Time eeCorps members receive:

- A living allowance of \$692.64 distributed twice per month up to a maximum of \$11,775. Taxes are deducted and the living allowance is distributed twice per month by direct deposit to the member's bank account.
- An education award of \$4,441.50 upon successful completion of term of service.
- It is possible to defer student loans while serving as an AmeriCorps member.
- Mileage reimbursement for travel to required eeCorps trainings, days of service, and program sites.
- Non-tangible benefits including extensive training, valuable experience, networking, and the opportunity to serve the local community in a crucial area of need.
- Ability to participate in regional EE leadership councils; option to obtain CAEE's nationallyrecognized Professional Environmental Educator Certification.
