## **Cairn Program**

Founded in 2008, Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado (VOC)'s Cairn Program engages 15-20 high school aged students throughout the school year in monthly outdoor activities and stewardship projects across the Front Range. Led by young adult mentors, students develop leadership skills, make new friends, learn about environmental issues facing Colorado, explore career paths, and have a hands-on impact as they plan and lead their own stewardship project (ex. trail building, planting, habitat restoration and park improvements)!



Since 1984, VOC has engaged more than 128,000 people to get involved in and become inspired to care for Colorado – a total donated labor value of nearly \$26 million.

#### **Requirements for Students**

Students may participate in the Cairn Program over multiple years, if they:

- $\square$  Are 14 18 years old **and** enrolled in grades 9 12
- ☐ Commit to once-a-month activities (September May)
- ☐ Have an interest in environmental stewardship

### **Requirements for Mentors**

Mentors may serve for several years and must meet the following criteria:

- ☐ Prior experience working with and leading youth
- ☐ Application, interview and successful background check
- ☐ Participate in Cairn Mentor Orientation (4 Hours)
- ☐ Attend monthly meetings and projects (approximately 7-10 Hours/Month) from September through May
